#### What is Motown Mission?

Motown Mission is a work mission and service trip destination in and around Detroit, MI for youth, college, and adult groups. They invite participants into economic disaster recovery work (greening, feeding and rebuilding) alongside Detroiters as a response to God's call to love our neighbor. All persons are welcome to participate in service regardless of religious affiliation, sexual orientation, gender identity or other cultural/ethnic or economic location. All participants are invited to reflect on their service through practices rooted in Wesleyan Theology, appreciative inquiry and diversity, equity and inclusion. Motown Mission was founded in 2005 through the United Methodist Church and continues in the spirit of the UMC's commitment to grace, mission, and service as a means for individual and communal transformation.

#### Who Can participate:

#### Motown Mission is open to:

- Family teams W/ vehicle (Youth with parent: \$150/student + \$125/adult- not to exceed \$550.00/family)
- Unaccompanied Students (Youth completed 6<sup>th</sup> grade 12<sup>th</sup> grade: \$200.00/student)
- Young Adult Mentors (applications required, age 18-25: \$125.00/mentor)
- Adult Leaders (age 26+ with driving/vehicle use: \$125.00/leader)

All participants must complete all required paperwork for both FUMC Northville and Motown Mission and follow all rules respectively for any organization we partner with in addition to the rules of FUMC Northville, meet deadlines, attend training, and maintain an active membership in the church while we prepare for the trip. The cost to implement Mission Quest can be greater than the fees charged, and the program is supported by FUMC Northville and the Missions Committee. General fund raising allows reduced rates for all and cost reductions for leaders and counselors who sacrifice their vacation time to support our youth while modeling the importance of service. All, including parents are appreciated and encouraged to help with the fundraising efforts of youth missions! Participant openings are limited, and priority is given to applications in order of receipt.
